We are deeply grateful for the heart-warming encouragement and support received from both Within and outside Japan in the aftermath of the Great East Japan Earthquake and Tsunami which struck on 11th March 2011. We will always cherish the precious bonds created during this time. We celebrated the second Obon holiday since the disaster. During Obon, many Japanese return to

their faraway family homes to visit with relatives. We hope that people who returned to lwate are able to see just how far we have come in our reconstruction.

Here is the latest news from Iwate's reconstruction.

Currently in the Affected Areas:

The Second Obon Holiday Since the Disaster

In August, during the second Obon holiday since the disaster, there were people in the affected areas visiting family graves and lighting bonfires in order to pray for the eternal rest of their ancestors and loved ones who died in the disaster.

Also, summer Coming-of-Age ceremonies were held in 11 of Iwate's municipalities coinciding with the Obon holidays. In Japan, age 20 is considered to be the age when one becomes an adult, and the young adults coming of age this year were only 18 when the disaster struck - the time when young people go on to higher education or their first jobs. This generation has renewed their decision to become a part of their community's reconstruction.

On August 11th, 7 of the affected communities (Noda Village, Miyako City, Yamada Town, Otsuchi Town, Kamaishi City, Ofunato City, and Rikuzentakata City) set off 20,000 fireworks as a eulogy for their lost loved ones and a prayer for the reconstruction.



The fireworks, which were organized by LIGHT UP NIPPON through contributions from all of Japan, lit up the dark night sky.

1. Publication of the "Iwate Reconstruction Report"

A report has been prepared on the current status and what has yet to be done for Iwate's reconstruction effort. More information will continue to be produced so that the reconstruction process can be more generally understood. This "open reconstruction" will incorporate both Japanese and foreign aid.

2. Revision of the Reconstruction Implementation Plan

One year after official adoption of the "Iwate Prefecture Great East Japan Earthquake and Tsunami Reconstruction Implementation Plan (Phase 1)", a new "Revised Reconstruction Implementation Plan" has been introduced, which takes into account newly adopted national policies and budgets. The revisions are also informed by the current status of the reconstruction, as well as the opinions of the local population.

This plan is hoped to lead to a further acceleration of Iwate's reconstruction.
